And all this with between 3 & 5 performers, all with extensive teaching and training skills

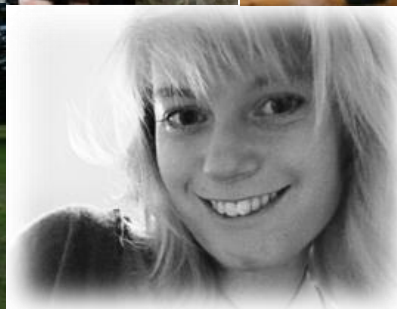
